From the Executive Director

Dear Friend of St. Vincent de Paul,

You are part of a great story – the story of St. Vincent de Paul Society in Dayton. In 2018 we celebrate 70 years since the Society organized the Dayton District. Because of your prayers, your time, your talent, and your financial contributions the Society has touched millions of lives over many generations right here in the Miami Valley. Our mission is to grow in holiness through personal service to the poor in our community, forging a just society by our example.

Over that time we have forged great relationships with many other organizations: churches, temples, mosques, human services charities, and local, state, and federal governments.

Over 30 years ago the Society of St. Vincent de Paul led the way when the Dayton community came together to house the homeless. Today we shelter about 400 guests, including 50 or 60 children each night. Over that same period our supportive housing services have grown to provide stable housing to 175 residents. Our food pantries provide thousands of meals for our neighbors who cannot afford all of their needs. Our community stores provide clothing and furniture for those most in need.

Our Vincentians, now numbering over 800 members in our 32 conferences across the region, provide person to person assistance to help our neighbors stay in their homes and supplied with sufficient clothing and food.

However that you are a part of our story – one of our 800 Vincentians, our 2,000 other volunteers, our 4,000 donors, or one of our many other friends, I hope that you will come celebrate with us at our 70th anniversary picnic.

Building Community with Supportive Housing Programs



Our Supportive Housing Programs provide integrated educational and residential support for eligible homeless individuals who are drug and alcohol-free and committed to becoming self-sufficient. Recently, those staying in our supportive housing programs got the chance to tour the Dayton Art Institute, as part of an initiative to help our guests reconnect with the community. For many on the trip, it was their first time inside the Dayton Art Institute.

Program Manager Mike Goebel said that the Supportive Housing Programs provide a place to stay for some of society's most vulnerable.

"I think a lot of times the folks who come into our programs are where they're at because of a lack of community," Goebel said, "And when people come together and experience community with one another and step up and they're there for one another, they have greater chances of succeeding in so many different areas of their lives."
